

Project Components

- Restored Theatre with 1600+ Seats
- Restored Main Street Lobby Entrance and Marquee
- Bodega, an urban market at the corner of Madison Avenue and Main Street, will be re-created.
- Full Service Bar & Restaurant, *Two25 at the Madison*. As a tenant paying rent to TMPA, *Two25* will underwrite a significant amount of the operating costs of the theatre, reducing user fees.
- Second Floor Multi-Purpose Event Spaces

- ADA Accessibility
- State-of-the-Art Audio Visual, Lighting and Networking
- Fully Restored Ornamental Plaster and Painting

- The Madison will have a dramatic, positive impact on Downtown Peoria and help bring life back to Main Street.
- The Madison is the last opportunity for historic theatre preservation, to celebrate Peoria's famous Vaudeville heritage.
- The Madison will expand affordable access to the arts in a comfortable, accessible facility.
- The Madison will create jobs construction and permanent focused on putting people to work in meaningful ways.

1. Downtown Revitalization

- Will bring over 100,000 people downtown annually for events, shows, movies, dining and more generating millions of dollars in economic impact for area businesses.
- Integral part of Peoria's burgeoning "Entertainment District" when coupled with the nearby Civic Center, Scottish Rite Theater, Peoria Women's Club and more.
- Rejuvenate a critical city block in the heart of Downtown Peoria.
- Located between the two largest hotels in Peoria.
- Rockford's Coronado Theater The Madison's "sister" theater has PROVEN the impact of a renovated downtown Theater, as published by *Forbes* Magazine.

2. Historic Preservation

- The last of the three original movie palaces downtown.
- Simply beautiful, irreplaceable and reflective of a period long past, but not to be forgotten including restored ornamental plaster, decorative painting, and marquee.
- Community reflections, memories and more. Those who have stepped foot in the Theatre once, remember it FOREVER.
- Designed by Frederic Klein a prominent architect from Peoria who designed buildings such as Peoria High School, Packard Plaza Building, Grandview Drive Pavilion, and more.

3. Access to Arts

- As a non-profit, one of The Madison Preservation Association's goals is to provide full spectrum access to local performing arts ranging from ballet and orchestra, to all kinds of concerts, theater, and national touring groups, as well as full film capabilities.
- TMPA will also provide access to visual arts with its displays of European influenced architecture, ornamental plaster, and decorative painting.

4. Targeted Employment Opportunities

- Will create hundreds of construction and professional services jobs.
- Will create approximately one hundred permanent jobs in the downtown area.
- With a major restaurant and event space, The Madison will provide employment opportunities ranging from turning the lights on, to coordinating and managing thousand-person events, and everything in between. Situated between Phoenix Community Development Services, State of Illinois Peoria Adult Transition Center, and Dream Center Peoria, and within walking distance of several other social service agencies, The Madison will have routine hiring opportunities providing weekly interviews, and allowing individuals to begin working within days of having need positively impacting lives every day.
- Many of these jobs and opportunities will be well-suited for people of all ages, including students, providing access to employment in one of the critically important areas of the city.

5. Youth Initiatives

The Madison will provide free or low cost opportunities to youth with a wide range of interests which will include:

- Arts performing and visual.
- Music business light and sound technicians, promotion, and managemen shadowing opportunities.
- Employment and mentoring opportunities.

6. Education

- The Madison Preservation Association will give everyone access to develop their interests, whether it be in visual or performing arts, design and architecture, theater preservation and management, food service and hospitality, and more.
- The Madison will be a place for all to develop into more educated, skilled, and well-rounded individuals.





About The Madison Preservation Association



The Madison Preservation Association is a 501c3 not-for-profit organization developed for the sole purpose of redeveloping, renovating and operating The Madison Theatre.

The Madison Theatre renovation includes the theater itself, as well as approximately 160 feet of two story Main Street frontage. The block begins at Madison Street and continues northwest up to and including what is now referred to as The Neon Bison (former Judge's Chamber). Over 25 community groups have been identified as potential users of The Madison. With groups ranging from Charter Organizations to single event users, 75-90 performances per year are anticipated at The Madison, with opportunity for more. In an effort to keep the space affordable for all types of users, the facility will have a fee structure with varying fees for different types of users. Accompanying the theatre renovation will be a full service restaurant and event space along the Main Street frontage, which will be a tenant to TMPA, paying rent and further underwriting operating costs of the theatre and reducing user fees.
